Acute Hospital Activity and NHS Beds Information

Quarter ending December 2013

Publication date – 25 March 2014



About this Release

This release comprises a quarterly summary of inpatient, day case and outpatient activity and bed statistics for NHS Scotland up to December 2013. It also includes revised annual emergency admissions and bed day figures up to March 2013 for the HEAT target on emergency bed days for patients aged 75 and over.

Key Points

- There were 379,425 acute inpatient and day case discharges in the quarter ending December 2013. This is an increase of 1.4% from the same quarter of the previous year.
- The total number of outpatient attendances in the quarter ending December 2013 was 1,177,324. This is an increase of 1.4% on the quarter ending December 2012.
- The number of available staffed beds in acute specialties was recorded as 16,223 in the quarter ending December 2013. This is an increase of 1.1% from 16,041 beds in December 2012.
- The rate of emergency bed days per 1,000 patients aged 75 and over has reduced by 9.5% over the past three years from 5,418 in 2009/10 to 4,905 in 2012/13.

Background

Outpatient, inpatient and day case activity data and beds information are collected across NHSScotland and are based on nationally available information routinely drawn from hospital administrative systems across the country.

The data contained within this publication are predominantly based on ISD(S)1 aggregate data returns. ISD(S)1 contains summarised data by NHS Board of Treatment, hospital and specialty, i.e. high level reports with no patient details.

Where possible, any missing or incomplete data has been estimated using the last complete data submission for the relevant NHS Boards. Details of the affected data can be found within the [Full Publication Report](#) and are highlighted within the relevant tables. Data for the latest time periods should therefore be treated as provisional.
